Representative Matters

Greg has represented clients in numerous high-stakes cases, including:

- Currently representing Bausch Health, a multinational pharmaceutical company, and one of its subsidiaries, Salix, in a contract dispute with the former CEO of Salix over the termination of her unvested equity awards.
- On behalf of a biotechnology company, securing the dismissal of a complex patent infringement suit brought by a multinational pharmaceutical company that sought over \$500 million in damages.
- Securing the dismissal of \$3.5 billion civil RICO and \$400 million civil contempt claims against a large financial institution.
- Securing the dismissal of securities fraud class actions against an energy company and the former CEO of a large advertising company.

Greg has also litigated significant cases to favorable negotiated resolutions, including a breach of fiduciary duty action involving the sale of the largest federally subsidized housing complex in the United States and a historic securities fraud class action against an international client.
